
Our Mission


Vancouver Thunderbirds Hockey Two Deep Method Reminder

- Minor Hockey Associations are responsible for reasonable safety and well-being of all minor athletes (under the age of majority) while participating in sport activities.
- Thunderbirds Hockey Locker Room Policy, which incorporates BC Hockey's Co-Ed Dressing Room Policy.
- Vancouver Thunderbirds players under the age of 19 are never to be left unattended in any dressing room at any time.
- Zero tolerance with respect to harassment, abuse and bullying (verbal and physical).
- Enhanced social media policy.
- The taking of any photographs or video in the dressing room is strictly prohibited.

TeamSnap

- TeamSnap will be the main communication method for all messaging

Projects

- Thunderbirds first mentality
- Use of affiliates for development purposes
- Goaltender development
 - Focus for this season will be on getting coaches trained and certified

Goal this season = one asst coach on every team

Goal in future = head coach + one asst coach on every team

Oversight of Atom / Peewee

Projects

- Coach Support program
- Coach Evaluation
 - Provide Support to Athletes in Training
 - Ensure that the practice environment is safe
 - Run an appropriately structured and organized practice
 - Make interventions that promote learning

Associate Director of Rep – Bruce Gregg

Coach Evaluation cont...

- Plan a Practice
 - Identify appropriate logistics for practice
 - Identify appropriate activities in each part of the practice
 - Design an Emergency Action Plan
- Analyze Performance
 - Detect individual skill performance
 - Correct individual skill performance
- Make Ethical Decisions
 - Apply an ethical decision-making process

Casual Players / Affiliates

DRAFT PROCESS

- Step 1: Get permission to add a player to your list
 - Atom/Peewee Bruce Gregg
 - Bantam/Midget Steve Yan-Klassen
- Step 2: Contact player's family to determine if they want to be an affiliate with your team. Inform Association.
- Step 3: Develop schedule for CP/AP to attend practices – needs to fit within their schedule and cannot conflict with their registered team. Share with Bruce/Steve who will provide information to Tasha.

Casual Players / Affiliates

- Step 4: For Games,
 - contact player's coach first to determine if available/eligible,
 copy Bruce/Steve
 - if approval given, approach family of player to invite
 - once confirmed, update the Thunderbird CP-AP Tracking
 Document

Atom Casual Players – max 5 games placement/league/playoff Peewee and above – max 10 games placement/league/playoff

A player can only affiliate with one team

Skills

- Vancouver Hockey School (Derek Popke)
 - 5 sessions for each rep team (cost shared with Association)
 - Schedule changes up to the teams to sort out
- Teams will still be able to use additional providers
 - Rostered coaches from other teams in Vancouver
 Thunderbirds nothing required
 - Rostered coaches from another association send name and birthdate to Tanya so we can have them added to the TBirds
 - Other on-ice providers: Must be approved by BC Hockey program for private organizations or persons and Special Event Sanction required
 - Dryland providers: Special Event Sanction required
