Support for Hope/ Agassiz Communities

Everyone knows that BC faced recent adversity with numerous mudslides and flooding. What you may not know is we had 47 TBird members from across two teams caught out in the Hope/Agassiz area. These amazing communities made sure that everyone, including our group, had food, provided shelter and in general kept spirits up as everyone involved all dealt with very little information and a tremendous amount of uncertainty. If your travels in the future take you through this area, if time allows we would love for you to plan a lunch/gas fill up/quick snack stop at the local convenience or grocery store so we can show our thanks for their generosity as they continue to recover.

Food Bank Drive

So far we have collected 22 boxes of food and raised \$1015 in cash donations as part of the TBirds Annual Food Bank Drive. Online donations will be accepted until December 31. The Food Bank is able to turn every \$1 cash donation into \$3 of food - so far we have raised \$1015 or \$3045 in food through our online link. Covid Protocol Updates

We anticipate there may be some additional information around the restrictions in the coming days/weeks. We will do our best to keep everyone apprised as soon as we are able to, but a reminder that we are not the ones making the rules and we do need to wait until we are provided the information from viaSport and/or our sport governing bodies. We ask that families who are travelling internationally over the break continue to monitor the federal government website to know how your personal situation needs to be managed and keep your team manager updated if your TBird attendance is impacted.



The past couple of days has shown us we are not quite through listening to press conferences or reading about new PHO orders. While we continue to have new challenges to face, we have also learned that we can overcome whatever comes our way. We don't know what new restrictions or shifts we will be facing over the coming days and weeks, but we know we have enormous capacity within our group to manage and maximize whatever we can do within the rules.

We have just passed the half way mark of the season, and there have been some awesome moments! We have hosted two outstanding tournaments - thanks Betty! We have welcomed almost 200 new TBird family members across all divisions. We have continued to grow our partnerships within the community and with businesses including renewing our sponsorship with Scotiabank for another three years. We have also had a chance to remember what it's like to celebrate as a bigger group at things like the TBirds Minor Hockey Night at the Canucks where we had 348 TBird players, families and friends in attendance.

I want to take a moment to thank all of our parents who are finding ways to stay positive and keep the focus on allowing the players to love the game - no matter what is showing on the scoreboard. It's not always easy, but it is so important in ensuring that players want to go to the rink - now and when they are 60.

We will be involved in a few exciting initiatives in the new year. The First Shift program will be led by Gary Hunter and Jeff Churchill and will give 30 brand new hockey players a chance to play for the first time. Thunder-NO-Ball '22 will return for a second consecutive virtual event. We are already receiving some amazing auction items that we can't wait to share with you in January. And we are planning for our biggest Family Day U6-U9 Tournament in February.

For now, I hope you all get a chance to take a bit of a break. Enjoy some time with friends and family, and please stay safe.

Volunteer Opportunities

Our association relies on our families to volunteer throughout the season. A refundable \$75 fee is collected during registration that is returned once 1) a minimum of three hours of volunteering per player is done for the association (ie roles signed up for on the Volunteer portal) AND 2) some type of support is given to their team. These are two separate elements with the same goal - creating a strong environment that will allow our players to develop both on and off the ice.


Division Ambassadors, team coaches and managers are automatically accounted for as they cover off far more hours than the base requirement, but all other families do need to look for ways to get involved.

We hope everyone is helping their team in some way already but if you have simply been coming and going to the rink, and hopefully cheering loudly, check with your team manager how you can help. Many things do not require hockey knowledge and most don't take a lot of time, but everyone needs to participate in making their team as great an experience as it can be - it is not only up to the team staff to make that happen.

In every newsletter we provide examples of current volunteer opportunities that are required for association programs that can be signed up for on our <u>Volunteer portal</u>. The portal is how we track if people have achieved their minimum three volunteer hours for the association element, so it is important to ensure you use the portal to sign up to help. Many roles can be filled by U15 or U18 players so their parents can sign up for them as it is only parents who are listed in the portal, but those hours will go to the family.

You are able to volunteer for any role that interests you and fits your schedule as your help is not limited to the division of your player(s). Often times it works better to volunteer for a division that needs help at a time/day that doesn't conflict with your own player's schedule. We are currently recruiting for a number of programs including Thunder-NO-Ball, First Shift, and the Family Day Tournament with more information here.
